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DECEMBER 2021

In November we talked about how staying connected to Jesus produces fruit—fruit of faith. This month we get to see some of that fruit in the everyday lives of Christians.

Finally, Pastor Tony Schultz has a lesson on seeds.

"Sing to the LORD a new song, for he has done marvelous things" (Psalm 98:1).

QUESTIONS TO SPARK DISCUSSION

FEBRUARY 2022

Do you like bugs? This month students are taking a closer look at what is going on in the grass underneath their feet. They learn how God created everything with a special purpose.
