This month we meet some kids who are learning how to put those gifts into practice.

Next, we have a MY SCHOOL story sent to us from West Bend, Wisconsin where eighth graders take on their teachers in a basketball game. Last year they raised money to help a student battling leukemia.

Finally, Pastor Tony Schultz tackles the question: what is Lent?
