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CYD's Objectives Could/Should Be Yours

The Commission on Youth Discipleship (CYD) mission statement says this: CYD is a unit of the WELS Board for Parish Services and as such, exists to encourage and assist WELS congregations and parents as they nurture youth in the Word from birth through high school.

The specific objectives CYD has relative to Sunday school follow. These would make great objectives for your own Sunday school program!

Through counsel, resources, support, and networking, CYD will assist WELS congregations as they develop and maintain Christ-centered Sunday schools and other Christian youth ministries. CYD assistance will encourage models of caring, organization, effective teaching, an outreach spirit, parental involvement, staff teamwork, and congregational philosophical and financial support...

CYD will help congregations to...

- Develop and nurture positive and professional Sunday school culture.
- Recognize Sunday school as a valuable ministry within the congregation.
- Develop effective Sunday school teacher recruitment approaches.

- Offer quality staff training, using resources that are consistent with the Scriptures and that equip teachers to be their very best.
- Develop strategies that improve parent involvement in the Christian education of their children.
- Coordinate their Christian education ministries, particularly those with Lutheran elementary schools and Sunday schools.
- Find ways to use LES staff members (if they have an LES) as resources for their Sunday school programs.
- Develop strategies for strengthening the pastor's leadership and involvement in Sunday school.
- Network with other LES and Sunday school staffs, pastors, staff ministers, and lay leaders to strengthen their Sunday school ministry.
- Research, develop, and promote new, effective models for part-time Christian education of children and teens.
- Use the *Christ-Light*® curriculum effectively.
- Use other existing WELS Christian education resources effectively (Examples: Vacation Bible school, one-day VBS, WELS Kids Connection).
- Develop strategies that use Sunday school as a vehicle for reaching out to the lost.
- Network with other WELS entities that have a vested interest in the advancement of Sunday school and similar ministries.

Great I deas from Great Teachers

One of the objectives of *Partners* is to communicate and share teaching ideas, tips, and helps with Sunday school teachers, superintendents, and pastors. Sunday School Parent's Day

One way to involve and cultivate the interest in your Sunday school is to have a Parent's Day. Plan it early. Set up chairs in the classrooms on Parent's Day. Hand out an outline of your lesson and purpose of each step so that visitors may follow along. Use the opportunity to familiarize parents with the lessons. Emphasize how each parent can review the story at home, review the memory treasure, and complete the take home activities with their children. Tell parents how important **they** are to their children and you, the teacher! (Taken from a previous issue of *Partners*).

Children Absent from Sunday school

When a child is absent from Sunday school because of illness or other family obligations, send the lesson and a short note to each student telling that student he/she was missed and hopefully they will be present the next Sunday. Include the memory verse on a separate strip of paper so they're sure to look at it. Address the letter to the child, because children love getting mail. Plus, they'll get their parents to spend time telling them the story/ lesson. Busy parents might just ignore the letter if it is addressed to them. You need to get your church or Sunday school to buy a pack of stamps for each teacher and a box of envelopes for each teacher (or provide envelopes with church information for return address). Use the computer to create strips of paper with the Bible verse for the day. Use sticky notes or note pads for handwritten messages. Encourage all the teachers to use this to show kids and parents that they are being thought of. (Submitted by Pastor Aaron Schoenike-St. John/St. Peter-Cleveland, WI)

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Did You Know...

- In 2002 there were 35,215 students in WELS Sunday schools.
- Since 1990 Sunday school enrollments have decreased by 8,344 students, a 19.2% drop (1990 = 43,559 students).
- In 2002 there were 5,303 Sunday school teachers in WELS congregations
- Since 1990 Sunday school teacher numbers have decreased by 809, a 13.2% drop (1990 = 6,112 teachers).
- There are currently 1,250 WELS congregations, an increase of 29 congregations or 2.3% since 1990 (1990 = 1,221 congregations).
