Imagine how the crowd around Jesus reacted when he said that adultery wasn't just an outward issue. God's expectations extend to even the hearts and minds of his people.

"Well, I've never actually had sex."

Jesus' words sink in; we realize that "never actually having sex" is not actually true, not from God's perspective. Every dumb joke we make in the locker room. Every time we go too far on date. Every time our eyes find the dark corners of the internet. Our Sixth Commandment report card has that same red "F" staring at us.

In these moments we especially appreciate how Jesus respectfully held up God's gift of sex, no matter how much others scrambled to jump up and tear it down. When we fail Sixth Commandment tests, we find answers only at the cross, where our Savior took our sinful words, actions, even our thoughts, and paid for them. Jesus aced the test for us; we are covered.

Through Jesus Christ and the waters of your baptism, God has made you a new creation. No sin owns you anymore! Treat the opposite sex with the same respect that God shows you. Be counter-cultural: join Jesus in holding up sex as a gift for husbands and wives. It's simply a matter of the new heart God has given you.
